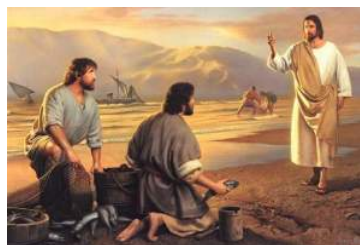

Come and See



"Do Not Be Afraid" — Matthew 1:18–25

Matthew tells the Christmas story through Joseph's eyes. While Luke highlights Mary's

encounter with God, Matthew shows us how Joseph is drawn into the mystery of the incarnation. Both Mary and Joseph say *yes* to God, but Joseph's "yes" comes at a moment of deep confusion and personal risk.

In Joseph's world, betrothal was legally binding, and Mary's unexpected pregnancy placed both of them in a vulnerable position. Joseph knew what the law required, yet he also knew that righteousness must be shaped by mercy. His plan to dismiss Mary quietly shows his compassion even before he understands God's full purpose.

Then the angel appears with the words heard so often throughout Scripture: *"Do not be afraid."* Joseph is invited to a leap of action—to trust a path he does not fully understand and to welcome a child who will change everything. His courage is shown not in grand speeches, but in quiet obedience.

Joseph's story asks us a question: When we face our own uncertain or painful moments, how do we respond when God whispers, "Do not be afraid"? Like Joseph, we may not see the whole picture, but God calls us to trust, to act with mercy, and to move forward in faith. God meets us in our fear and leads us toward hope.

- Rest in God's presence (*Contemplatio*): Notice God's presence and be still, surrounded by God's love.
- Choose to act (*Actio*): Trusting in God's nearness, commit to action rooted in love.

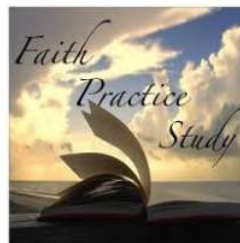

Charitable Giving

Year-End Charitable Giving via a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)



If you are looking to lower your taxable income, you may want to consider a QCD. If you are age 70½ or older, IRS rules require you to take required minimum distributions (RMDs) each year from your tax-deferred retirement accounts. This additional taxable income may push you into a higher tax bracket and may also reduce your eligibility for certain tax credits and deductions. To eliminate or reduce the impact of RMD income, charitably inclined investors may want to consider making a qualified charitable distribution (QCD).

A QCD is a direct transfer of funds from an IRA custodian, payable to a qualified charity, as described in the QCD provision in the Internal Revenue Code. Amounts distributed as a QCD can be counted toward satisfying your RMD for the year, up to \$100,000, and can also be excluded from your taxable income. This is not the case with a regular withdrawal from an IRA, even if you use the money to make a charitable contribution later on. In this scenario, the funds would be counted as taxable income even if you later offset that income with the charitable contribution deduction.

Please consult a tax advisor to learn more. If you are 70½ or older, own an IRA, and donate to charity, QCDs may make sense for you; consult a tax advisor regarding your specific situation.

- Develop an attitude of gratitude: o Research has shown that “counting your blessings” can help reduce depression, lower stress, and reduce blood pressure.
- Commit to an active a lifestyle as possible: o Any increase in physical activity can have a positive impact on heart health, strength, and overall fitness.
- Make quality sleep a priority: o Getting sufficient quality and quantity of sleep can help with maintaining a healthy wait, and lower risk factors for health conditions such as heart attack, stroke, and diabetes. It also improves mental clarity and focus.
- Make a plan to strengthen social relationships: o Research has shown that having satisfying relationships with friends and family can improve happiness, decrease the risk of health problems, and help you live longer.
- Look for ways to brighten someone else's life: o Giving to others is routinely cited as one of the ways individuals can feel most fulfilled. Sometimes referred to as the “Helper's High” – giving to others has been shown to cause the release of feel-good neurotransmitters!
- Make lifelong learning a habit: o Learning a new language or craft or to play a musical instrument can result in improved memory. Learning something new is literally a work out for your brain... at any age!
- Prioritize maintaining your health: o In the hustle and bustle of the holidays and of every day life it is easy to put off screening care – routine cancer screenings, eye exams, and primary care visits have been associated with better over health, less complications from chronic disease, and longer life expectancy.
