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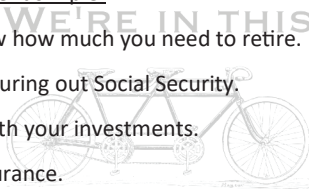
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VISION 2024

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PARISH ADMINISTRATION

Parish Pastoral Council

The Parish Pastoral Council is a consultative body made up of twelve to sixteen members who collaborate with the Pastor by serving as a unifying and coordinating structure for all aspects of parish life: worship, service, education, formation, evangelization, stewardship, and justice and community outreach. The Council strives to develop a unified vision among parishioners and also provides direction for the appropriate actions necessary to attain this vision. The primary concern of the Parish Pastoral Council is implementation of the parish's Mission and Vision.

Finance Council

The Finance Council is responsible for budgeting, reporting, and analyzing parish financial data (church & school). The Council has the responsibility to keep the parishioners updated on the financial condition of the parish and, through the sound management of funds, to ensure a balanced budget. All parish fundraising activities, as well as all major expenditures, both capital and expense, are reviewed by the finance council.

LITURGICAL MINISTRIES

Music Ministry

The members of the Music Ministry sing and play to accompany the weekly Sunday Liturgies at 9:00 AM, 11:00 AM, and 7:00 PM, as well as join together for special parish events and celebrations.

Music of all styles and genres are part of the parish repertoire. All voice parts and instruments are welcome. Instrumentalists should be proficient on his/her instrument at a basic level.

Cantors and Psalmists

Cantors are the leaders of song for all weekend Masses. The cantor's responsibilities include leading the assembly in hymns, songs and responses, proclaiming the Responsorial Psalm, and teaching new music, when necessary. Cantors meet/rehearse as a group as needed, and attend choir rehearsals as much as possible. The psalmist proclaims the verses of the Responsorial Psalm, and leads the assembly in the refrain.

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Children's Choir

The age of children's choir members ranges from Grade 2 through Grade 8. The choirs sing on average once per month at a Sunday Mass, as well as other parish special events and celebrations. The children's choir leads the assembly in song. Children in grades 6-8 are encouraged to begin training for the ministry of cantor.

Men, women, and teens are invited to carry the processional cross to lead our community into prayer and worship. Ministers carry the cross for the entrance and gifts processions, and the recessional at all our weekend Masses and special occasions.

Altar Servers

Children and youth in 4th grade and above are welcome to serve as altar servers. This ministry provides children and youth the opportunity to assist in the celebration of the liturgy as book bearers and table servers. Because of the intimate involvement with the liturgy, the ministry of altar server leads children to a greater appreciation of the Mass, and a deeper awareness of the importance of Christian service. Lectors

Lectors proclaim the Word of God during liturgy, at all weekend Masses (Saturday evening, Sunday morning, Sunday evening) and Holy Days. Preparation includes praying with the readings before Sunday, and individual practice of the readings. Lectors are trained through both the diocesan Office of Worship School of Liturgy programs and the parish. They are encouraged to practice at the ambo with the microphone, and to participate in various continued formation opportunities. Schedules are created based on individual availability and needs of the parish.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion for Liturgy

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion for Liturgy serve the community by assisting in the distribution of communion at all parish liturgies. Ministers distribute both the Precious Body and Precious Blood, as communion is offered under both forms at all Masses. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are trained through the diocesan Office of Worship School of Liturgy programs. Once that training is complete, individuals are prepared to serve at Christ Our Light by parish staff or experienced EM's. Catechists

Catechists share their faith through a planned and guided curriculum with students in grades Pre-K through 6. Catechists may or may not be experienced professional teachers.

Elementary Faith Formation Classes

The Elementary Faith Formation offered at Christ Our Light strives to be in partnership with parents in the religious instruction and faith formation of children in grades Pre-K through 6 in an effort to realize the development of responsible, respectful persons who celebrate God's love. Classes are offered on Monday afternoons, grades 1-6, Tuesday afternoons, grades 1-4, Wednesday evenings, grades 5-6, and Sunday morning, Pre-K (3 yrs – K). The opportunity for parents/guardians to Home School EFF is an option for grades 1-6. Parents/guardians are required to have a conversation with the Director addressing their need/desire to Home School. All registration policies and fees apply. Families receive a schedule of meetings and homework turn-in dates. All EFF families are encouraged to participate in a selection of parish events.

Children's Liturgy of the Word

Those who facilitate this ministry proclaim the Sunday readings to children during the 9:00 AM and 11:00 AM Sunday Mass. Following the Opening Collect, the children are dismissed to the ministry center of the church. Adult facilitators proclaim the day's Scripture readings and encourage the children to participate in a scripted, interactive homily. Facilitators are scheduled approximately eight times a year. Vacation Bible School

Christ Our Light offers VBS to children aged 4 years to entering 5th grade. Volunteer help is needed to lead groups of children through activities, prepare refreshments, assist with arts and crafts, games, and skits. LIVING IN THE LIGHT SACRAMENT PREPARATION

First Reconciliation Preparation

Children in second grade or older, together with their parents/guardians, attend two events in the fall of the year in preparation to celebrate this sacrament of God's love and forgiveness. This process requires assistance with set up, refreshments, hands on activities, and facilitating the textbook lesson. First Reconciliation precedes the celebration of First Eucharist. Children celebrate the sacrament for the first time during the parish Advent Reconciliation Service or the parish Lenten Reconciliation Service as decided by the family.

Children in second grade or older, together with their parents/guardians, attend three events through the winter months in preparation to celebrate First Eucharist. This process requires assistance with setup, refreshments, hands on activities, and facilitating the textbook lesson.
