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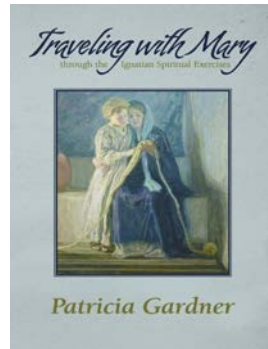

Traveling with Mary - Patricia Gardner

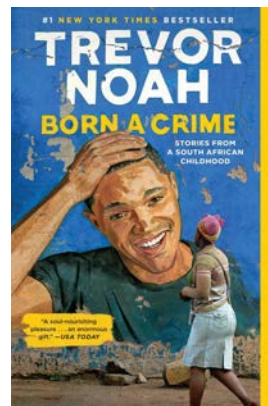

- Choose to act (*Actio*): Trusting in God's nearness, commit to action rooted in love.

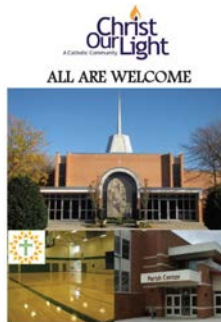

Climate Change

We know that the main factor in global warming is the release of greenhouse gases (such as carbon Dioxide – CO₂ and Methane – CH₄) into the atmosphere by humans. In the book Everyday is Earth Day by Harriet Dyer (2021), carbon footprint is described in terms of what carbon gases are emitted by one person as well as the footprints created by a chain of individuals and organizations.

As an example, you decide to purchase a cotton T-shirt made in China. At first look, you would consider that your carbon footprint would be the gas you used in your car to drive to and from the store. But it is more complicated, and the footprint is actually much larger. One needs to consider the energy needed to grow and water the cotton, manufacture the T-shirt, ship the shirt from China, and store the T-shirt in a warehouse or store. This indirect carbon footprint is the equivalent of approximately 20 lbs. (five two-liter bottles of soda) of CO₂ being released into the atmosphere.

We can make small changes in our routines that can make a difference, one person, one family at a time. Since last week we were talking about recycling, we can start there.

Recycling facts from Everyday Is Earth Day (2021):

- It saves 10 -15 tons of CO₂ a year or the equivalent of taking 3.5 million cars off the roads.
- Recycling aluminum uses 95% less energy than making it from raw materials.
- Recycling paper uses 40% less energy and every ton of recycled paper saves 17 trees.
- By recycling plastic, 70% less plastic is created.
- For every 1 job in waste management and disposal, 4 jobs in recycling industry is needed.
- It costs governments twice as much to send waste to landfill than to recycle it.

Tips:

- Buy new things less often. Ask yourself if you really need the item. Can I borrow the item or purchase it secondhand? If clothing, consider purchasing the highest quality you can afford and consider classic styles as opposed to trendy fashions that will go out of style quickly. The fewer items you buy results in having fewer items to dispose of at the end of their cycle.
- Rethink your internet shopping. Do you really need the item within the next 24 hours? Can you buy it locally rather than having it shipped? This saves the fuel in delivery by air or truck to your doorstep, as well as the cardboard, plastic, and other packaging used to ship it.
- When you do decide to shop online try the following: pick up at local store; don't accept multiple shipment orders; and request "frustration-free packaging (Amazon option)". Item is shipped in easy-to-open recyclable materials with minimal waste.

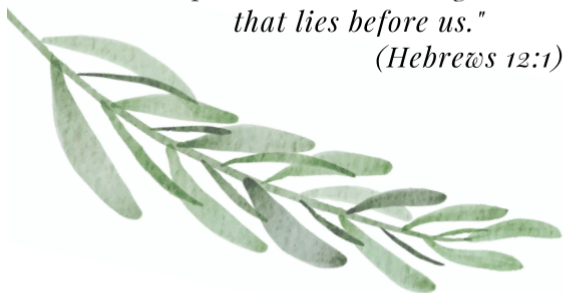

Sunday, May 8, 2022
Accompanying One Another

Today's readings: Acts 13:14, 43–52; Psalm 100:1–2, 3, 5; Revelation 7:9, 14b–17; John 10:27–30. Why does it seem that differences in culture, religion, or preferences frighten people? This appears to be the situation in the first reading today. The Jews grew jealous when Paul and Barnabas included the Gentiles in a Sabbath gathering. One group saw themselves as more deserving than the other and grew angry and violent. They wanted to keep the faith contained among those like themselves.

In the Gospel, Jesus identifies his sheep as those who “hear my voice” and “follow me.” Jesus gives them “eternal life.” Jesus’ sheep only need to hear his voice and follow him. It seems so simple, yet often people complicate

Christianity as they judge by appearances. Fear can lead to anger and ultimately to excluding people who have many gifts and talents to offer our communities.

When fearful of others, it is essential to pray for the grace to see people as God sees them, to recognize the presence of God within those who come to us seeking to join our journey of faith. Our prayer should lead us to treat each person with dignity and respect. May we strive to imitate the reverence for others that is apparent in Pope Francis’ statement: “The Church will have to initiate everyone—priests, religious and laity—into this ‘art of accompaniment’ which teaches us to remove our sandals before the sacred ground of the other” (*The Joy of the Gospel*, 169).



THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, May 9

The Voice of the Shepherd

Think of the people you love and how it feels when you hear one of them say your name. Often, the voice of a loved one is soothing. Jesus knows and calls us by name; if we are listening, comfort and security will be found even while facing challenges. Today, allow yourself a few moments of silence to hear your name being called by the Good Shepherd, and know the gift of peace. Consider meditating on the words of Sunday's responsorial psalm: we are his people, the sheep of his flock. *Today's readings: Acts 11:1–18; Psalm 42:2–3; 43:3–4; John 10:1–10.*

Tuesday, May 10

A Hand to Hold

Jesus lets his doubters know that his followers, his sheep, are secure with him. “No one can take them out of my hand,” he says, “and no one can take them out of the Father’s hand. The Father and I are one.” No matter the situation or adversary, Christians can rest assured that God cares for them. *Today's readings: Acts 11:19–26; Psalm 87:1b–3, 4–5, 6–7; John 10:22–30.*

Wednesday, May 11

Light in Darkness

“I came into the world as light, so that everyone who believes in me might not remain in darkness,” Jesus states in today’s Gospel. Unable to see in the dark, people often become afraid. The darkness we find ourselves in can be as literal as when the electricity is out during a storm, or figurative such as when the future seems uncertain. When you feel enveloped by darkness, remember to look for Jesus to light your path. *Today's readings: Acts 12:24–13:5a; Psalm 67:2–3, 5, 6 and 8; John 12:44–50.*

Thursday, May 12

God Is Good

“For ever I will sing the goodness of the Lord,” we sing in today’s responsorial psalm. What are the blessings in your life? Love, faith, family, friendship, a place to call home, our health, a job are some of the blessings that might come to mind. Many of these we take for granted. Grace, mercy, and faithfulness are God’s promise to us. Even a moment of gratitude opens us to the fullness of this promise. *Today's readings: Acts 13:13–25; Psalm 89:2–3, 21–22, 25 and 27; John 13:16–20.*

Friday, May 13

Have Faith

Just as Jesus tells the disciples, he also tells us, “Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me.” How often we allow our hearts to be troubled. It seems as though worry and fear can become a way of life. Spend time with the Gospel, placing yourself in Jesus’ hands as you contemplate that he is “the way the truth and the life.” *Today's readings: Acts 13:26–33; Psalm 2:6–7, 8–9, 10–11ab; John 14:1–6.*

Saturday, May 14

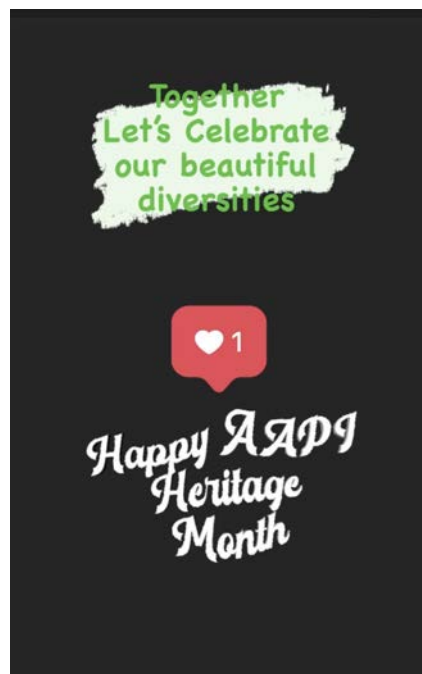
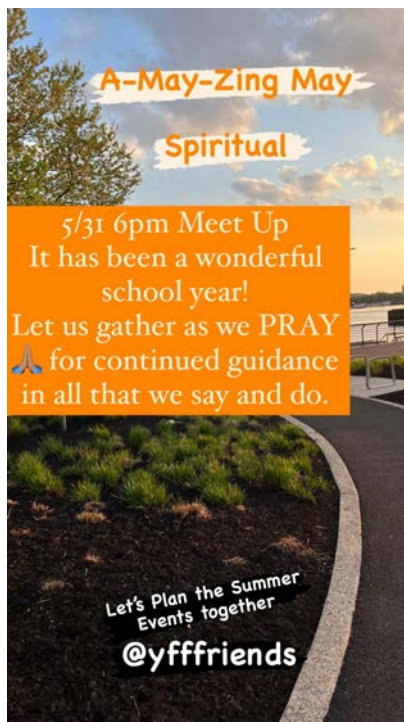
Faithful and Kind

In today’s Gospel, Jesus asks his followers to come to him in prayer. “Whatever you ask in my name, I will do so that the Father may be glorified in the Son,” he says. 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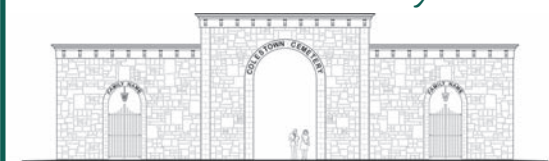
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
